### **PE & Sports Premium Funding 2019 - 2020**

#### Background

The government has provided funding since 2013 to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sports provision.

The funding, which the DfE have announced doubled for 2017 -2018, is ring fenced and is delegated to schools and intended to improve school facilities to support a range of healthy pupils activities, including PE and sports, after school activities and healthy eating.

#### **Purpose of funding:**

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

#### **Vision:**

All pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and leave with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

**Objective:**

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

We would expect indicators of such improvement to include:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport
